("San Pedro HSR") filed on November 20, 1991. Two abstracts were prepared for proposed

water rights for two stockponds (SP001 and SP002). Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) has reviewed the abstracts and on May 10, 2019, submitted comments. The abstracts have been revised consistently with ADWR's determination of the correct locations of the stockponds.

In 1994, the Special Master issued a Memorandum Decision, Findings of Fact, and Conclusions of Law for Group 1 Cases involving Stockwatering, Stockponds, and Domestic Uses, dated November 14, 1994, amended February 23, 1995, approved and modified September 27, 2002 ("Decision"). The Decision established the procedures for adjudicating *de minimis* water rights for claims in the San Pedro watershed. When proposed water right abstracts have been prepared, "the litigants will be provided an opportunity to suggest the correction of mistakes in the proposed abstracts." Decision, p. 47. This proceeding is not a forum in which to relitigate the Decision, which was the subject of years of briefing and has now been affirmed for more than 14 years. Subsequently, these abstracts will be included in a catalog of proposed water rights where they will be subject to very limited set of objections and ultimately in a final decree.

As required by the Decision, revised, proposed water right abstracts for two stockponds have been prepared for water rights for two stockponds analyzed by watershed file report no. 113-13-007. The abstracts are attached as Appendix A.

IT IS ORDERED that any suggested corrections to the proposed abstracts shall be filed on or before August 6, 2019.
