The following attorneys appear telephonically: Laurel Herrmann on behalf of the San Carlos Apache Tribe; Kimberly Parks on behalf of ADWR; Brad Pew observing on behalf of the LCR Coalition; Robin Interpreter on behalf of the Yavapai Apache Nation and observing for the Pascua Yaqui Tribe; Richard Palmer on behalf of the Tonto Apache Tribe. Robert Farrier, landowner, is present on his own behalf.

A record of the proceedings is made digitally in lieu of a court reporter.

LET THE RECORD REFLECT that Mr. Farrier filed a statement of claimant for two acre feet of water for irrigation approximately 30 years ago. The Arizona Department of Water Resources investigated the claim and found that the land was not being irrigated.

Mr. Farrier states that he *does* want to pursue his claim for irrigation water rights and would like to pursue a claim for surface water rights for domestic use and stock water use claim. Discussion is held.

Mr. Farrier requests additional time to file an Amended Statement of Claimant.

IT IS ORDERED granting Mr. Farrier's request to have additional time to file an Amended Statement of Claimant. The amended Statement of Claimant shall be due by not later than **March 9, 2020**.

Mr. McGinnis addresses the Court and requests leave to intervene in this matter.

LET THE RECORD REFLECT that if Mr. Farrier files an amended statement of claimant, the Court will review the claim and determine whether it should go forward in this adjudication or whether ADWR should conduct another investigation before proceeding. Once Mr. Farrier files his claim and it appears on ADWR's public records, the Court will determine how to proceed and will issue a minute entry to that effect.
