The United States filed an Amended Report dated July 28, 2017, that identified all wilderness areas within the Gila River Basin System for which the United States has claims based on federal reserved water rights that have not been settled or are not the subject of an active contested case. It separated the wilderness areas into two categories: (1) the 13 wilderness areas for which a

statement of claimant has been filed; and (2) the 40 wilderness areas for which no statement of claimant has been filed.

As the Court reported in *In re Gen. Adjudication of All Rights to Use Water In Gila River Sys. & Source*, 212 Ariz. 64, 68, 127 P.3d 882, 886 (2006), the Arizona legislature declared that "an early focus by the general stream adjudication courts" should be the determination of Indian and non-Indian federal water claims. This order of priority arose from a need "to plan for the impacts that the federal water rights may have on the welfare of this state." 1995 Ariz. Sess. Laws, ch. 9, § 25(C) (1st Reg. Sess.). In this Adjudication, the court has focused on the San Pedro River Watershed. Based on the Amended Report, all wilderness areas in the San Pedro River Watershed subject to claims for federal reserved water rights for which a statement of claimant has been filed have been settled or are in the process of being adjudicated. In its Amended Report, The United States lists three wilderness areas in the San Pedro River watershed subject to claims based on federal reserved water rights for which a statement of claimant has not been filed.

According to the United States, the preparation of the statements of claimant for the 40 wilderness areas that it identified throughout this Adjudication will require a substantial commitment of time and resources. Thus, it is important that the claims should be prioritized so that the United States can focus its efforts on those claims that should be considered consistently with the process currently adopted in this Adjudication. As this Court is currently adjudicating claims in the San Pedro River Watershed and has ordered the Arizona Department of Water Resources to prepare a San Pedro II – Sierra Vista Hydrographic Survey Report (HSR) pursuant to §45-256 to report on claims filed in the Sierra Vista subwatershed since the issuance of the San Pedro HRS on November 20, 1991, dates for the preparation of statements of claimant for wilderness areas in the San Pedro River watershed will be set. If the United States has not filed statements of claimant for wilderness areas in the remaining watersheds in this Adjudication at

such time as the Court initiates action with respect to a new area, then a hearing will be set to consider appropriate and reasonable filing dates.

IT IS ORDERED that the United States shall file by August 31, 2018, a statement of claimant for the Miller Peak Wilderness Area;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the United Stated shall file by August 30, 2019, statements of claimant for the Galiuro and Rincon Mountain wilderness areas.
