ORDER ESTABLISHING **GROUNDWATER FLOW MODEL** TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

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CONTESTED CASE NAME: In re Subflow Technical Report, San Pedro Watershed **REPORT INVOLVED**: Addendum to the Groundwater Flow Model of the Upper San Pedro Groundwater Basin, February 2025.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The order establishes a technical committee to develop a groundwater flow model for the upper San Pedro Groundwater Basin. A Technical Committee progress consultation is scheduled for Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at 10:00 am.

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On February 20, 2024, Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") filed the Groundwater Flow Model of the Upper San Pedro Groundwater Basin ("the Model"), intended to underlie the cone of depression and subflow depletion tests for the San Pedro River Watershed. In response to objections filed to ADWR's technical report, the Special Master issued an order instructing ADWR to file an addendum to its technical report that clarifies various aspects of the report. The addendum, filed on February 7, 2025, provided clarification regarding the basis for certain parameters and assumptions in the model, the geographical orientation of the model, and the rigor of the model's calibration. The addendum also proposed updates to the current model and a timeline for completion of those updates.

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To minimize technical objections to the revised model recommendation, and to expedite the updates themselves, the Special Master instructed the parties and ADWR to form a technical committee. W1-103, Minute Entry (Mar. 6, 2025). Specifically, the Special Master requested that parties provide nominations to the Court for individuals with qualified modeling expertise willing and able to work with the Arizona Department of Water Resource on finalizing the Upper San Pedro Groundwater Basin Groundwater Flow Model. *Id*.

IT IS ORDERED that the Upper San Pedro Groundwater Model Technical Committee ("the Committee") shall consist of the following members:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, no later than March 28, 2025, Committee members shall forward their email, phone number, and time zone information to water@jbazmc.maricopa.gov. After the office of the Special Master has received the above requested contact information, it will forward the contact information to ADWR who will reach out to committee members to set up an initial meeting.

COMMITTEE PURPOSE

The fundamental reason for the Committee is to bring together a collection of

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MEETING GUIDELINES

The Committee shall meet at least monthly in a meeting space provided by

qualified technical experts who will collaboratively work through the technical challenges associated with creating a complex groundwater analytical model. The expected outcome of this Committee is the development of the best possible groundwater analytical model of the Upper San Pedro Groundwater Basin.

The Committee will not be an adversarial forum. Committee members are not invited by this Court to participate as representatives for a client or a position, but rather as representatives for science and advocates for the most reasonable scientific solution given time and cost constraints. Committee members should aim for robust discussion without fear of disagreement, but discussion must revolve around science. Advocacy for a legal position will result in removal from the Committee.

Further, in keeping with the goals of the Committee, the Court will appoint only experts to the Committee. This Committee comprises technical people doing technical work. Nonetheless, parties who did not provide a nomination for the Committee can keep apprised of Committee discussions and may ultimately contest Committee recommendations incorporated in the Model. The Committee will regularly report progress to the Court and interested parties through quarterly progress consultations. In addition, minutes of Committee meetings will be filed with the Court and posted online. Any party concerned about the direction of the Committee may voice their opinion to the Special Water Master during any scheduled progress consultation.

It cannot be overstated that, in the development of the Model, all parties should be aligned with the goal of an accurate model. To foster an environment of cooperation and promote straightforward dialogue regarding the Model, Committee discussions should focus only on the technical aspects of the Model. Minutes of the Committee meetings will be filed with the Court for anyone to review, and progress consultations with the Court will be open to the public.

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ADWR. The Committee shall discuss progress with the Special Master during quarterly (or more frequent) progress consultations scheduled by the Special Master. Two chairs will lead the Committee, one member elected by the Committee and one representative from ADWR. In the event that a member is not able to attend a meeting, a proxy is permitted to attend. However, any proxy must still be able to provide meaningful input. Committee members are free to contact each other and research or discuss issues outside of scheduled meetings, especially where there are scheduling conflicts and challenges. Committee members shall communicate about substantive matters with ADWR only during scheduled meetings.

ADWR shall file, within five business days of a Committee meeting, a summary of the meeting. Meeting summaries will not be subject to comment or objection. Errors in a summary, though unlikely, may be addressed at the next progress consultation. Each summary shall include the following:

- A copy of the agenda
- A list of attendees
- Start and stop times
- A brief description of discussion items
- Assigned action items with due dates
- Issues assigned to the next meeting
- Any issues that need the attention of the Special Master

PRELIMINARY MEETINGS AND INITIAL PROGRESS CONSULTATION

ADWR shall schedule the first meeting, which shall be held no later than **April** 11, 2025. A second meeting shall be scheduled at the convenience of Committee members, but no later than **May 9, 2025**. The first two Committee meetings may be scheduled as online only. The following Committee meetings must be hybrid, i.e. held in-person and accessible online.

After the first two Committee meetings, the Special Master will hold a progress

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consultation on Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. A process to expediently resolve disagreements within the Committee, if necessary, will be discussed at that time. The members of the Committee shall attend and provide the Special Master with the following information:

- A proposed schedule for Committee meetings between June and November 2025,
- 2) A proposed schedule for two or more progress consultations with the Special Master between June and November 2025 held at least once a quarter.
- 3) A list of all issues subject to disagreement.
- 4) Requests for direction from the Special Master.
- 5) A proposed timeline for development of the final model.

The Minute Entry from the May 14, 2025, progress consultation will announce the schedule for progress consultations between June and November 2025.
