CASE MANAGEMENT ORDER REGARDING CONE OF DEPRESSION TEST METHODOLOGY

A well located outside the subflow zone whose cone of depression reaches the subflow zone and affects the streamflow may be subject to this adjudication. In re the General Adjudication of All Rights to Use Water in the Gila River System and Source, 198 Ariz. 330, 9 P.3d 1069 (2000) ("Gila IV"). In 2005, Judge Ballinger issued an Order that determined testing standards, techniques, modeling, and other criteria concerning the measurement of cones of depression created by well pumping. Order filed September 28, 2005 ("2005 Order"). The Court also focused on the jurisdiction of the adjudication over wells in the context of cones of depression and concluded that a well will "be subject to adjudication if the extent of the well's current or prospective depletive effect on the stream is measurable by reasonably accurate means." 2005 Order, p. 36. On January 27, 2017, the Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") filed a Demonstration Project Report entitled "De Minimis Assessment & Cone of Depression Test Methodology" for the San Pedro River Watershed (the "Report"). The parties filed comments and preliminary objections to that portion of the Report concerning the Cone of Depression Test Methodology and a conference was held on March 15, 2017.

Based on the oral statements at the conference, uncertainty appeared to exist as to whether the purpose of the Cone of Depression Test was to:

- 1) determine which wells located outside of the subflow zone will be included within the jurisdiction of this adjudication; or
- 2) evaluate individual wells to determine whether a particular well's cone of depression affected the subflow zone.

 Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District and the Salt River Valley Water Users Association ("SRP") argued that the Report was intended to identify the wells subject to the adjudication and a separate proceeding would be necessary to establish the test to determine whether a specific well's cone of depression depleted the subflow and the amount of the well's production attributable to subflow. Counsel for the Arizona Department of Water Resources stated that the Report was prepared to propose a methodology to identify the wells to be included within the adjudication and not for the purpose of determining whether a particular well has a cone of depression that intersects the subflow zone. The logical corollary of this position is that the Report, in the form ultimately adopted, will be used to exclude wells from this adjudication under state law.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The Cone of Depression Test is intended to be used for the purpose of identifying which wells located outside of the subflow zone will be included, under state law, within the adjudication and subject to the court's jurisdiction. This determination does not preclude the use of the same or similar methodologies or variations thereof to be incorporated into future tests to be used in the next phase of this process.
- 2. Arizona Department of Water Resources shall file by May 12, 2017, its response to the parties' objections and comments that were filed by March 6, 2017. The response shall include, but need not be limited to, a discussion of the following issues:

- a. The basis for adopting a conceptual model with hard rock barriers and a perennial stream instead of a model that provides for mountain front recharge;
- b. The reasons to use or not use the Jacob Non-Equilibrium Equation with an Image Well in addition to other methodologies;
- c. The basis for the use of the data and methodology selected to calculate pumping rates for irrigation and municipal wells;
- d. The basis for the selection and calibration of the data to determine transmissivity values used in the modeling; and
- e. The determination of the locations of the wells and the expected margin of error between the location of a well modelled in the Report and the physical location of the well determined using GIS coordinates.
- 3. The parties shall file objections, expert reports and initial Arizona Rule of Civil Procedure 26.1 disclosure statements concerning the Cone of Depression Test Methodology by August 18, 2017. All parties shall have a continuing duty to disclose as required by and in the manner provided in Rule 26.1(b) (2).
- 4. The parties shall file by August 25, 2017, proposals regarding procedures to establish an appropriate methodology required by the *Gila IV* Court that Arizona Department of Water Resources may apply to determine and establish that a particular well is pumping subflow and the fraction of the discharge attributable to subflow. Parties shall also identify issues that should be resolved in connection with the approval of an appropriate test.

- 5. A conference shall be held on September 13, 2017, at 1:30 p.m. to consider the proposals and initiate a third stage of this subflow process.
- 6. A pretrial conference shall be held on October 11, 2017, at 1:30 p.m. to address additional scheduling and any procedural matters the parties desire to raise.
- 7. All discovery including depositions shall be completed by January 31, 2017.
- 8. Trial on the Cone of Depression Test Methodology shall begin on March 5, 2018, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. each trial day. The conferences and trial will be held in Maricopa County Superior Court Building, Courtroom 301, 201 West Jefferson Street, Phoenix, AZ 85003-2202.
