LET THE RECORD REFLECT that the United States is not represented and have been excused for today's proceeding.

The Special Master notes receipt of the updated WFR from ADWR and asks for clarification on the discrepancies on the report.

Counsel Brown addresses the Special Master. As to the abstracts, he explains that they included the properties to the East and those are outside of the WFR. They intend to align with ADWR's proposal and note that the previous abstracts are incorrect.

Discussion is held regarding the small reservoir. Counsel Brown notes that the reservoir was probably not included because it's located East of the WFR location on another parcel. Counsel Nielsen notes that it was dry from 2007 through 2023 and it is noted on page four of the report.

Discussion is held regarding priority date and the point of diversion. Counsel Brown asks for guidance on which date to use as the priority date. He notes that the 1903 right was for pasture and now there is just two de minimis domestic wells.

The Special Master notes that there is a change in use and change in diversion. Due to the issue of change in point of diversion still pending before Judge Blaney,
