4 This court order opens a case to determine rights to use water on the parcels listed 5 above, that the Pinal County Assessor has identified as owned by Benjamin, Phillip, and 6 **Robert C. Clark**. Current landowners who intend to pursue any potential water rights 7 associated with this case must attend the initial status conference scheduled for Thursday, 8 July 17, 2025, at 11:30 a.m. Interested Parties MUST attend the scheduled initial 9 conference if they plan to pursue potential water rights. Failure to appear at the initial 10 conference could result in the dismissal of the case and the loss of water rights associated 11 with the property. The conference will be held virtually using the Court Connect program. 12 Instructions for Court Connect are attached as Attachment A.

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### 14 **SUMMARY OF CASE**

Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") records indicate that Benny
E. Clark filed Statement of Claimant 39-2582 on December 17, 1979, claiming water for
irrigation and domestic uses dating to 1862. The filing of a Statement of Claimant declares
an individual's intent to claim a water right and begins the process of pursuing that water
right with the Court.

ADWR investigated the claimed water uses and issued Watershed File Report No. 113-04-DCD-003 in 1991. After the Watershed File Report was issued, the public was allowed an opportunity to object to the findings in the report if they believed that there were errors or insufficient documentation. This case will determine water rights existing on the property associated with the relevant Watershed File Report and resolve the objections to the Watershed File Report.

The Court recognizes that there has been a long delay between the filing of the initial documents and the initiation of this case. Because of this delay, the property may have changed ownership or may have been subdivided. Nonetheless, current landowners

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1 may still obtain water rights. Below is a summary of the water uses found on the property
2 at the time of the Report:

ADWR public records do not contain any assignments of the Statements of Claimant listed in the Watershed File Report nor do landowners appear to have filed any additional Statements of Claimant since the issuance of the Report. Arizona law requires that for parties to obtain a legal water right, they must provide proof of their right by presenting to the Court an updated and accurate Statement of Claimant claiming the relevant water use, in addition to a matching basis of right, e.g. a statement of claim, decree, stockpond claim of right, or water right certificate. Landowners must present the following in order to acquire a water right:

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A. Evidence of past water use on their property.

B. An accurate Statement of Claimant in their name. The current landowner may fulfill this requirement by either filing a new statement of claimant or obtaining an assignment or amendment of a preexisting statement of claimant.

C. A basis of right accurately describing the claimed use.

If the property owner is able to provide proof to the Court of the existence of a water right on their property, the Court can recognize an enforceable water right in a "Final Decree." Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-257(B).

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### **OBJECTING PARTIES**

Objectors to a water right claim must present the Court with a specific statement objecting to specific claimed attributes. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-256(B). The following entities have filed objections in this contested case: the Gila River Indian Community, San Carlos Apache Tribe, Yavapai-Apache Nation (collectively "the Tribes"); the

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United States, joined by the Tribes; Magma Copper Co. (currently BHP Copper) and
 ASARCO Inc.; and Salt River Project.

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### General Background on the Water Rights Determination Process in Arizona

A general stream adjudication is a judicial proceeding to determine the quantity and priority of all water rights in a river system. Arizona is undertaking general stream adjudications of both the Gila River and the Little Colorado River systems. A river system includes surface 6 water flowing "in streams or other natural channels," groundwater sufficiently connected to that surface water, and water (both surface and groundwater) subject to claims by the federal government. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-251(7). Recognizing and respecting water rights and the 9 priority of such rights is important in Arizona where times of drought or water scarcity can 10 occur.

11 All cases begin with the filing of a "Statement of Claimant," ("SOC") in which a property 12 owner makes a claim for a right to use surface water on their property. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-13 254(A). This person is the "claimant." The SOCs contain, among other characteristics, a 14 description of the source and quantity of the water used, the location of use, the location from 15 which the water was diverted, and the date when the water was first put to use. Id. § 45-254(C).

16 After the property owner files the SOCs, the Arizona Department of Water Resources 17 ("ADWR") prepares a "Watershed File Report," ("WFR") in which ADWR investigates the 18 claims in the SOCs and recommends water rights associated with the property. Id. § 45-256(B). 19 ADWR compiles all WFRs for a watershed into a comprehensive Hydrographic Survey Report 20 ("HSR") and publishes the report for public review and comment. In response, other claimants in 21 the Adjudication may file "objections" disputing the information or recommendations in the 22 WFR. The individuals who file objections are called "objectors."

23 This "contested case", one of thousands in the Gila River System, will evaluate claims 24 asserted in specific Statements of Claimant while considering objections to the WFR that reported 25 ADWR's initial inspection of those claims.




