26	The State of Arizona is currently	undergoing a General Stream Adjudication to
27	determine water rights and create an ac	curate, enforceable record of those rights. In

Arizona, surface water, and water pumped from some wells,¹ belong to the public. An
enforceable right to use this "appropriable" water may be acquired after review and
approval by Arizona's General Stream Adjudication Court. This Court has been instructed
to evaluate claims to use water in much of the state of Arizona and to determine the date
of first use, amount, and type of water use. This process, the "general stream
adjudication," is currently evaluating PINAL COUNTY PARCEL Nos. 300-26-055,
300-26-074, and 300-26-075.

8 This order opens two cases to determine rights to use water on the parcels listed 9 above, which the Cochise County Assessor has identified as both owned by Jose L. and 10 Mary E. Garcia. Any current landowner who intends to pursue any potential water rights 11 associated with these cases must attend the initial status conference scheduled Thursday 12 May 1, 2025, at 11:00 a.m. Interested Parties MUST attend the scheduled initial 13 conference if they plan to pursue potential water rights. Failure to appear at the initial 14 conference could result in the dismissal of the case and the loss of water rights associated with the property. The conference will be held virtually using the Court Connect program. 15 16 Instructions for Court Connect are attached as Attachment A.

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18 **SUMMARY OF CASE**

Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") records indicate that Jose L.
Garcia and Pat V. Chester filed Statements of Claimant 39-328 and 39-1179, respectively,
in 1979, claiming domestic water uses in Section 16 of Township 6S, Range 16E. The
filing of a Statement of Claimant declares an individual's intent to claim a water right and
begins the process of pursuing that water right with the Court.

ADWR investigated the claimed water use and issued Watershed File Report Nos. 114-04-BA-203 and 114-04-BA-209 in 1991. After the Watershed File Reports were issued, the public was allowed an opportunity to object to the findings in the reports if

they believed that there were errors or insufficient documentation. This case will
 determine water rights existing on the parcels mentioned above and resolve the objections
 to the Watershed File Reports. Because the parcels identified in both Watershed File
 Reports are now owned by the same party, they will proceed through the process together.

5 The Court recognizes that there has been a long delay between the filing of the 6 initial documents and the initiation of this case. Nonetheless, current landowners may still 7 obtain water rights. Below is a summary of the water use(s) found on the properties at the 8 time of the Reports:

ADWR public records do not contain any assignments of the Statements of
 Claimant listed in the Watershed File Reports nor do landowners appear to have filed any
 additional Statements of Claimant since 1991.

If a property owner provides proof of the existence of a water right on their
property, the court can recognize an enforceable water right in a "Final Decree." Ariz.
Rev. Stat. § 45-257(B). Landowners must present the following in order to acquire a water
right:

- A. Earliest evidence of water use on their property.
- B. An accurate Statement of Claimant in their name. Current landowners may fulfill this requirement by either filing a new statement of claimant or obtaining an assignment or amendment of a preexisting statement of claimant.
 - C. A basis of right accurately describing the claimed use, e.g. a statement of claim, decree, stockpond registration, or water rights certificate.
- 27 **OBJECTING PARTIES**

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Objectors to a potential water right must present the Court with a specific

statement objecting to specific potential water right attributes. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-256(B). The following entities have filed objections in these contested cases: the Gila 3 River Indian Community, San Carlos Apache Tribe, Tonto Apache Tribe, the Yavapai-4 Apache Nation, the United States, Salt River Project, and Jose Luis Garcia.

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General Background on the Water Rights Determination Process in Arizona


A general stream adjudication is a judicial proceeding to determine the quantity and priority of all water rights in a river system. Arizona is undertaking general stream adjudications of both the Gila River and the Little Colorado River systems. A river system includes surface water flowing "in streams or other natural channels," groundwater sufficiently connected to that surface water, and water (both surface and groundwater) subject to claims by the federal government. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45-251(7). Recognizing and respecting water rights and the priority of such rights is important in Arizona where times of drought or water scarcity can occur.

All cases begin with the filing of a "Statement of Claimant," ("SOC") in which a property
owner makes a claim for a right to use surface water on their property. Ariz. Rev. Stat. § 45254(A). This person is the "claimant." The SOCs contain, among other characteristics, a
description of the source and quantity of the water used, the location of use, the location from
which the water was diverted, and the date when the water was first put to use. *Id.* § 45-254(C).

After the property owner files the SOCs, the Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") prepares a "Watershed File Report," ("WFR") in which ADWR investigates the claims in the SOCs and recommends water rights associated with the property. *Id.* § 45-256(B). ADWR compiles all WFRs for a watershed into a comprehensive Hydrographic Survey Report ("HSR") and publishes the report for public review and comment. In response, other claimants in the Adjudication may file "objections" disputing the information or recommendations in the WFR. The individuals who file objections are called "objectors."

This "contested case", one of thousands in the Gila River System, will evaluate claims
 asserted in specific Statements of Claimant while considering objections to the WFR that reported
 ADWR's initial inspection of those claims.




