This matter came before the Court to quantify the United States' federal reserved water rights for Fort Huachuca. Fort Huachuca ("The Fort") was created as a military reservation when President Chester A. Arthur issued Executive Orders on October 29, 1881 and May 14, 1883, withdrawing lands from the public domain and reserving them for military purposes. President Arthur's October 29, 1881 order included approximately 41,760 acres of land. President Arthur's May 14, 1883 order added an additional approximately 3,040 acres of land. The Fort now encompasses 73,142 acres of land.

On January 4, 1982, the United States Army Communications Command and The Fort filed two Statements of Claimant (SOC) which were docketed under numbers 39-10774 and 39-10775. Statement of Claimant No. 39-10774 was amended on August 5, 1991, and on January 16, 2002. As amended, this statement of claimant states that the basis of the claim is "federal reserved water rights" for "military installation purposes," with a date of priority of October 28, 1881. Statement of Claimant No. 39-10775 was amended on May 7, 1992 and again on August 5, 1992. As amended, the statement of claimant states

that the basis of the claim is "federal reserved water rights" for "military installation purposes," with a date of priority of October 28, 1881. Objections to the SOCs were lodged by numerous parties. Special Master John E. Thorson initiated this contested case, *In re Fort Huachuca*, Contested Case Number W1-11-605, in February, 1995.

This case was divided into two phases. In the first phase, numerous findings of fact and conclusions of law were entered and approved. See Report of the Special Master; Motion for Adoption of Report; and Notice for Filing Objections to the Report, April 4, 2008 ("Phase 1 Report") approved and modified by Order Granting the Special Master's Motion for Adoption of the April 4, 2008 Report Regarding Fort Huachuca, September 7, 2011 ("September 2011 Order"). The second phase consisted of an 18-day trial that occurred between October 3, 2016 and February 14, 2017. The Court issued an Order Quantifying Federal Reserved Water Rights for Fort Huachuca on September 6, 2024. This decree implements the Court's Orders.

#### **DECREE**

As described in more detail in the attached abstract, the United States has a federal reserved water right to 1,548 AFA of water from the groundwater appurtenant to Fort Huachuca, all of Huachuca Canyon streamflow, and all of Garden Canyon streamflow to be used for military and military related purposes (including uses for morale, welfare and recreation programs), with a priority date of October 29, 1881. If the United States ever constructs infrastructure and storage allowing it to use the decreed streamflow water, then its federal reserved water right to groundwater, measured on a basis concurrent with its use of the surface water use, would be reduced by that use.

IT IS ORDERED approving the abstract of water rights concerning Fort Huachuca attached hereto as Exhibit 1. That abstract shall be included in the final decree for this general stream adjudication to be entered and approved by the Court pursuant to Section 45-257(B) of the Arizona Revised Statutes and Section 17 of the Rules for Proceedings Before the Special Master.
