DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: This Order denies the United States' motion for leave to file a late response to objections to the Special Master's March 25, 2024, Report.

On March 25, 2024, the Special Master filed a report¹ recommending an approximately 10-year plan for Hydrographic Survey Reports ("HSRs") in the Gila River General Stream Adjudication and the Little Colorado River General Stream Adjudication. The deadline for written objections to the report was September 23, 2024. On December 18, 2024, the United States ("U.S.") filed a *Motion for Leave to File a Response to Objections* ("Motion"), in which the U.S. requested permission to file a response to comments filed by the Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") and the

objections filed by the Tonto Apache Tribe ("TAT"). Both the ADWR and the TAT filed their documents to the Special Master's Report by September 23, 2024. The U.S. states that it did not file the Motion earlier because there was no objection to the Special Master's Report, and the U.S. was conferring with parties. Motion at 1.

While this Court encourages the parties to work together, timeliness is essential. Three months is simply overdue.

IT IS ORDERED that the US Motion for Leave to File is DENIED.²
