FILING A CIVIL SUIT

- ➤ Civil suits in Superior Court involve amounts of \$10,000 or more.
- The forms and instructions needed to start a Civil Lawsuit.
 - Certificate of Compulsory Arbitration This required form concerns whether the dollar amount involved in the case is under \$50,000 and that no party seeks affirmative relief other than a money judgment. If the amount is \$50,000 or less and no party seeks affirmative relief other than a money judgment, the case is subject to compulsory arbitration per Maricopa County Superior Court Local Rule 3.10 and the Rules of Civil Procedure for Superior Court 72(b). See Rules of Civil Procedure for Superior Court 72(b)(3) for exceptions to this rule.
 - Maricopa County <u>Statewide Coversheet</u>
 - Civil Summons
 - Civil Complaint
- The defendant must be served with a copy of the summons and complaint within 90 days per Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 4(i)
 - Forms and Instructions on how to serve a defendant in a civil suit.

FILING AN ANSWER

- > The forms needed to file an Answer to a Civil Lawsuit.
 - Certificate of Agreement Regarding Compulsory Arbitration This required form concerns whether you agree if the case is subject to the rules for Compulsory Arbitration. If the amount is \$50,000 or less and no party seeks affirmative relief other than a money judgment, the case is subject to compulsory arbitration per Maricopa County Superior Court Local Rule 3.10 and the Rules of Civil Procedure for Superior Court 72(b). See Rules of Civil Procedure for Superior Court 72(b)(3) for exceptions to this rule.

- <u>Blank Motion Form</u> This form is used to answer a complaint. Use the first 3 pages of this packet discarding the instructions and the Order.
- See Arizona Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 12(a).
