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Rule 122.1


Allows use of all portable electronic devices in courtrooms/courthouse

Photos or audio/video recording in courtroom must comply with Rule 122

Most radio reporters will ask permission to use an audio recording device and/or microphone or they may submit a request

AO 2013-059: Use of camera in court buildings requires "express permission"

No cameras allowed to film in an empty courtroom without the Presiding Judge's approval (TV commercials/ standups)



Rule 122: Cameras in the Courtroom

Basics of Amended Rule

Presumption in favor of cameras and access

Specific findings required to deny camera request

Limitations on coverage in rule:

- * *No recording when judge is off the bench*
- * *No jurors*
- * *No attorney conferences*
- * *No readable documents*
- * *No cameras in juvenile proceedings*

If a party timely objects OR the court plans to deny any portion of the request, the court must hold a hearing prior to the proceeding.

Judge's division shall notify parties AND the media representative via email and may send a follow up minute entry.

If the media fails to appear for the hearing, the camera request will be deemed abandoned and the hearing vacated.

Time for hearing: any time before proceeding for which request was submitted
