WHEREAS, Sections 6-201.01 and 6-202.01 of the Arizona Code of Judicial Administration provides that credit toward court-ordered community restitution requirements are awarded on the basis of actual hours completed unless otherwise authorized by the Court; and

WHEREAS, the Adult Probation Department has issued a formal policy, Community Restitution Program Policy # 31.020, which provides guidelines for awarding additional community restitution credit to a probationer for successful completion of Special Work Projects and Educational Programs, and in special circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Criminal Department judges have reviewed this policy and endorsed the issuance of the following administrative order,

IT IS ORDERED that the Adult Probation Department Community Restitution Program may award additional community restitution credit to a probationer for providing Special Work Project services and for successfully completing specified Educational Programs as outlined in the Adult Probation Department's Community Restitution Program Policy # 31.020, Section III (Revised November 15, 2008). The Community Restitution Program director may also award additional community restitution credit when special circumstances are found to exist. The Community Restitution Program director shall provide the Chief Probation Officer with a written monthly report citing the specifics and rationale for any such reward.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Administrative Order expires automatically without further Order on a date ten (10) years from the date of issuance in accordance with Arizona Code of Judicial Administration, Section 3-402(C), unless sooner modified, amended or replaced.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED vacating Administrative Order No. 2001-033.
