ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, the Court has established policies for Juvenile and Adult Probation Department officer safety training and for arming of certain categories of probation department officers in compliance with Arizona Code of Judicial Administration Section 6-113; and

WHEREAS, the Court seeks to have the same policies and procedures for arming of probation department officers in both the Juvenile and Adult Probation Departments,

IT IS ORDERED the Juvenile and Adult Probation Departments shall follow the same procedures for applying for and evaluating requests by probation department officers to carry firearms.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the Juvenile and Adult Probation Departments shall utilize the same psychologist in the evaluation process.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Administrative Order expires automatically without further Order on a date ten (10) years from the date of issuance in accordance with Arizona Code of Judicial Administration, Section 3-402(C), unless sooner modified, amended or replaced.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED vacating Administrative Order No. 2005-089.
