ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
NO. 2013-104

Whereas, the Superior Court of Arizona in Maricopa County is experiencing an urgent need for qualified English<>Marshallese and English<>Grebo court interpretation, transcription, and translation owing to a demand for interpretation services for Marshallese speaking defendants, victims and witnesses, and lack of availability of current contractors; and

Whereas, the existing court interpreter vendors do not have qualified and reliable Marshallese language interpreters;

Due to these circumstances and the urgency in providing interpretation, transcription, and translation services to judicial divisions and other vital court programs, it is necessary to temporarily engage the services of qualified providers. This action will avoid delays and continuances of cases requiring English<>Marshallese and English<>Grebo interpretation, transcription, and translation services. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Midwest Interpreting/Translation Services (MITS) be able to provide English<>Marshallese and English<>Grebo contract court interpreters and court translators during the period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.
2. Midwest Interpreting/Translation Services (MITS) be compensated at the rate of \$75.00 per hour for in-person assignments, with a minimum of 8 hours per day. For telephonic interpretation, the rate will be \$45.00 for the first 30 minutes, then \$1.50 per minute thereafter. All travel, lodging, and ground transportation expenses will be borne by the Court. In addition, MITS will receive a per diem of up to \$50.00 per day provided that receipts are submitted with invoice.
3. Midwest Interpreting/Translation Services (MITS) be compensated at the rate of \$75.00 per hour for translation and transcription of documents. MITS will also be compensated for supplies and postage for translation and transcriptions.
4. Midwest Interpreting/Translation Services (MITS) be exempt from providing proof of liability and professional insurance.

5. Midwest Interpretation/Translation Services (MITS) abide by the Code of Ethics and Standards of Conduct for Court Interpreters established by this Court.
