The Governor has declared a state of emergency in Northern Arizona due to an uncontrolled forest fire endangering populated areas of the State. Pursuant to Supreme Court Administrative Order 2002-59, attached hereto,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. All in-custody matters in the Superior Court and Justice Courts requiring Sheriff transportation officers are continued from June 21, 2002, to a time to be reset by the Court. All time from June 21 to the new setting is excluded due to extraordinary circumstance. The extraordinary circumstance is the redeployment of Sheriff officers from Maricopa County to Northern Arizona to protect life and property and to maintain order. This continuance will be excluded from the computation of time under Rule 8.2, 8.3 and 27.7, Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure.
  
2. Constables are authorized by the Presiding Judge to serve orders of protection, writs of garnishment and any other civil process ordinarily served by the Sheriff's Department.
