and stockponds.

dispute between the United States and the Hopi Tribe on one side and the remaining parties on the other side regarding whether a federal reserved water right for stockponds, stock and wildlife watering could be granted for a specific quantity of water to be obtained from a number of sources of water without specifying the amount of water that could be obtained from any single source.

On June 21, 2019, the Navajo Nation moved for the adoption of a different procedure and schedule than the approach outlined at the June 4, 2019 oral argument. It proposed that briefing should occur in *In re Hopi Reservation HSR* with respect to the attributes or characteristics necessary to quantify the Hopi Tribe's federal reserved water rights and then a second round of briefing should address the question of evidence necessary to quantify and finally adjudicate the Hopi Tribe's federal reserved right claims for stockponds, stock and wildlife watering. The United States did not file a response to the motion and no other party objected to the Navajo Nation's proposal. The City of Flagstaff indicated its willingness to meet with the parties to discuss the possibility of entering into a limited stipulated agreement concerning certain *de minimis* uses. *City of Flagstaff's Response to Navajo Nation's Motion*, filed July 12, 2019 at 3.

Based on the Navajo Nation's motion, it appears that the Navajo Nation does not desire that the evidentiary issues regarding its claims for stockponds, stock and wildlife watering be considered at this time in *In re Navajo Nation*. Accordingly, the proceedings to be held in *In re Navajo Nation* anticipated in the Order dated May 6, 2019 in *In re Navajo Nation* and discussed at the June 4, 2019 oral argument will not be scheduled.

In its Response, the Hopi Tribe argues that the same attributes and characteristics to support water rights may not be required to define the respective federal reserved water rights of the Navajo Nation and the Hopi Tribe. It contends that the necessary attributes and characteristics of federal reserved water rights is not a purely legal issue, but must be resolved in the factual context

of the determination of federal reserved water rights for each reservation. The Hopi Tribe also requested a Pretrial Conference because uncertainty exists as to the legal issues that should be briefed in *In re Hopi Reservation HSR*.

IT IS ORDERED granting the Hopi Tribe's request for a Pretrial Conference in *n re Hopi Reservation HSR*. It will be held telephonically on **August 29, 2019 at 8:30 a.m.** The purpose of the Pretrial Conference will be to determine if there are issues in *In re Hopi Reservation HSR* that should be briefed at this time with respect to the necessary attributes and characteristics of federal reserved water rights for water use on the Hopi Reservation and, if so, what categories of use should be the focus of the briefing. Not all uses should be at issue. For example, the amount of water obtained from each source of water used for mining was not disputed in the first phase of this case. The issue involving water used for mining concerned the allocation of the metered amount of water pumped from eight specific wells.
