By minute entry dated June 19, 2018, a deadline of December 14, 2018 was set for the parties to file disclosure statements and expert report. On December 7, 2018, Pima County Flood Control District (PCFCD) filed a motion to extend the deadline to January 28, 2019. The motion was granted and a status conference was set for February 8, 2019. On January 28,

2019, Salt River Project and Arizona State Land Department timely filed Initial Rule 26.1 Disclosure Statements and Salt River Project filed an expert report. On January 28, 2019, PCFCD filed a motion to stay disclosure and discovery and vacate the status conference set for February 8, 2019, (the "Motion") representing that it had negotiated proposed abstracts for the water rights at issue with all parties except the Tonto Apache Tribe and San Carlos Tribe (the Tribes) because on January 22, 2019 the Tribes raised a chain of title issue.

Proposed abstracts for water rights were not attached to the Motion. Thus, a determination cannot be made as to whether the resolution of the single issue identified by PCFCD will resolve all objections to the water right characteristics involved in the abstracts. In addition, PCFCD and the Arizona State Land Department have filed suggested corrections to proposed abstracts issued. By February 4, 2019, the Tribes will be filing any suggested corrections they may have to those abstracts. On February 1, 2019, Arizona Department of Water Resources will be filing a report regarding the proposed abstract for 113-11-002-SW002. Due to the uncertainty as to the status of the agreement among the parties to proposed abstracts,

IT IS ORDERED denying the Motion. The Tribes and PCFCD shall file Initial Disclosure Statements and expert reports with respect to those issues that they believe are in dispute by **February 5, 2019**. Based on the information received at the status conference, an appropriate deadline will be set for the parties to file supplemental initial disclosure statements and expert reports.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties will provide proposed abstracts at the status conference that contain water characteristics for which there is mutual agreement and identify those specific water characteristics about which there is disagreement.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that PCFCD will provide title documents at the status conference that it has currently available concerning the land for which water rights are claimed.
