Ms. Williams was ordered to file notice 21 with the Court by May 31, 2024, of her progress filing pre-adjudication documentation. 22 The letter was filed with the Clerk of Court, but there was no indication that it was served 23 to all parties on the Court Approved Mailing List and is therefore attached to this order as 24 Attachment A. 25 26 A. The purpose of the Little Colorado River Adjudication. 27 Through a system of water rights, Arizona has regulated surface water since before

statehood. A water right tells you the maximum amount of water that you may use, the

purposes for which it may be used, the area where it may be used, and the priority date of your water use in the event that there is a water shortage.

The purpose of this legal proceeding is to recognize and decree water rights throughout the Little Colorado River Basin in Arizona so that the state can manage its surface water resources more fairly and effectively. This is different from a typical lawsuit, as there are neither "plaintiffs" nor "defendants." No party to this proceeding is claiming that you have done something wrong, and no party is seeking a remedy from you. This case is not an action to keep you from using water.

Nonetheless, it is important that you participate in this proceeding. Having water rights will protect you from potential, future claims of interference with others' rights. Further, when all water rights claims in the Little Colorado River Basin have been adjudicated and are included in a "final decree," parties whose claims have been dismissed will have forfeited their water rights. Such a forfeiture could result in legal action under Arizona Revised Statutes section 45-112 or civil liability.

### B. Service requirements for all parties.

Any document filed in this case (including the June 5, 2024, letter) must be served on all addresses on the Court-Approved Mailing List for this specific contested case. The current Court Approved Mailing List is attached to this order as Attachment B.

#### C. Availability of resources for claimants.

The Arizona Adjudications Project, legal clinic with the University of Arizona ("Project"), is taking applications from parties seeking help with their adjudication claims. Although the Court cannot guarantee that the Project will take on your case, the Project is an option for people who would like help with the adjudication process but may not be able to retain legal counsel. The telephone number for the Project is **520-621-6722**.

If you have administrative questions regarding this proceeding, please call the Office of the Special Water Master is (602) 372-4115. Please keep in mind that Court

staff cannot give legal advice.

If you have questions regarding stockpond registrations or permit applications, the telephone number for ADWR is **1-866-246-1414**.

#### D. Arizona Department of Water Resources Assistance.

The Arizona Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") is the state agency that assists the Adjudication Court with such matters as accepting the filing of Statements of Claimant ("SOCs") and amendments and modifications of SOCs and investigating and reporting on water uses. ADWR may be able to help current property owners determine if former Claimants properly registered the potential water rights claimed on the SOCs for this contested case and provide assistance regarding the correct filings if additional information is need by the Court. While they cannot provide you legal advice, you are urged to contact ADWR with questions regarding historical filings and the process moving forward.

# IT IS ORDERED that ADWR shall file a status report by September 5, 2024, that includes the following:

- 1. Describes the status of all surface water filings on Navajo County Assessor
  - Parcel 208-03-004C.
  - Identifies all potential water rights described in Watershed File Report 33-50-CBA-001 and located on Navajo County Assessor Parcel 208-03-004C for which no surface water filing has been made.
  - 3. Provides instructions for completing pending surface water filings on Navajo County Assessor Parcel 208-03-004C.
  - 4. Provides instructions for initiating surface water filings for potential water rights identified in #2 above.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Donna Williams attend a status conference on November 7, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. to declare whether she intends to continue participating in these proceedings. The failure of Ms. Williams to appear will result in the dismissal of this case and all associated SOCs. The status conference will be held using the Court Connect program. Instructions for Court Connect are attached as Attachment C. If you receive this Order by email, click on the red box "Join Court Connect Hearing" on the attached instructions to make an appearance. 

I am a very private person who enjoys peace and quiet. I live in a secluded area because people tend to misbehave.

I do not have a computer in my home that is connected to a printer or have internet access. These items are not critical to my survival. I do need water for survival. We are all suffering the effects of the drought we are in.

My family is a hardworking group. We could be considered "blue collar workers". My grandparents filed a homestead claim that they struggled to prove. The land is soaked with their blood, sweat and tears. In 1925 they were given a land deed, complete with water rights. As their heir I am guaranteed these rights.

Now we are all involved in this case. I have to ask, "WHY"? Nothing has changed. There is a stock tank that is valuable. It is a divot dug in the earth to slow down the natural runoff of water. The animals drink it, some evaporates, some soaks back down into the water table and the rest of it flows on down the country like it always has. Has someone's greed brought us to this?

I have been asked for construction documents. No such documents exist. The family couldn't have seen the need for such. They decided, "the house goes there, the barn there, the chicken coop..." In fact, they probably didn't even have a spare piece of paper.

On November 29, 2004 the AZ Department of Water Resources received our application to register this stock tank. Many attempts have been made to accomplish this since that date. I have resubmitted the application to the AZ Department of Water Resources. As of June 3, 2024 I have had no response from them.

I truly hope this matter can be resolved now and without additional time and expense to all parties. If not, I respectfully request this to be on hold until November. I am in Logistics for Wildland fire and it is now fire season for much of the country.

I thank you for your time and consideration. Please, let's resolve this peacefully.

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Phoenix, Arizona, has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Ivan B. Williams

has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the northeast quarter of Section thirteen in Township eleven north of Range eighteen east of the Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona, containing one hundred sixty acres,

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor-General:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant the tract of Land above described; forever; subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the
