The Nature Conservancy obtained four Certificates of Water Right for instream flow in four reaches of Aravaipa Creek from Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR). In its Statement of Intent and Revised Consolidated Abstracts, filed February 15, 2018, The Nature Conservancy claimed instream flow rights based on the four Certificates of Water Right to

Reaches A, B, C, and D of Aravaipa Creek. Draft abstracts based on Watershed File Reports 115-04-011 and 115-05-054 have been prepared with quantities consistent with the Certificates of Water Right. In its Report filed May 21, 2018 (ADWR Report), ADWR reviewed the draft abstracts and mapped the locations of the instream water rights.

A separate proposed abstract was not prepared for an instream wildlife use included in Watershed File Report 115-04-012. Proposed Water Right No. 115-04-011-WL001 appears to encompass the potential water right listed in Watershed File Report 115-04-012, for which a draft abstract has been prepared. Thus, at this point the unanswered question is whether The Nature Conservancy regards 115-04-012-WL001 as a potential water right separate from 115-04-011-WL001? If not, then The Nature Conservancy needs to determine whether it will seek dismissal of Statements of Claimant 39-2116 and 39-11371.

The second issue to be addressed has been raised by the ADWR Report that states that additional information and further direction is required because the "location of the current flow of Aravaipa Creek is not completely within land owned by The Nature Conservancy at all locations." Report at 1.

IT IS ORDERED setting a status conference to ascertain The Nature Conservancy's intent with respect to Statements of Claimant 39-2116 and 39-11371, to ascertain the additional information and direction required by ADWR, and address any related procedural procedures that ADWR's request may entail.
