hereby created. Once this partial catalog is completed, the catalog will be filed along with a certificate of service with the Clerk of the Court. §15.04, Rules for Proceedings before the Special Master.

During the subsequent 60 day objection period, water users and other claimants may examine the proposed abstracts of water rights. Objections regarding quantity will not be considered because reasonable quantification methods have been adopted in this case. Permissible objections, i.e., objections that could not have been asserted during the original 180-day objection period to the San Pedro Hydrographic Survey Report, to the proposed water rights in the catalog will be resolved by the Special Master if the objector can establish:

- (a) Resolution of the objection will demonstrably protect or improve the objector's own water right; and
- (b) Resolution of the objection will provide relief that could otherwise not be obtained in a post-final decree enforcement proceeding.

Id. at p. 39.

Except for the objections set forth above, no other objections to the proposed rights included in the partial catalog whether filed in connection with the San Pedro Hydrographic Survey Report or to the catalog will be considered before the Special Master files a final report and, further, the Special Master will "recommend that, upon entry of the final decree, these remaining objections be dismissed." *Id*.
