On January 2, 2019, the United States requested that the status conference set in this case for January 11, 2019 be vacated because the United States Department of Justice is not fully funded allowing the attorneys to either prepare for or attend the status conference. In addition, the United States has requested an extension of the time for filing objections to the Report of the

Special Master on Methodology for Determination of Cone of Depression issued on November 14, 2018 ("Report").

## Status Conference

The status conference scheduled for January 11, 2019 was set to permit all of the parties to hear a brief presentation from ADWR about its Initial Subflow Depletion Test Report. It was also set for the purpose of providing a forum to generally address the issues listed in the order as well as issues that the parties may have raised as part of a process to develop a fair and economical procedure to adopt a test for wells located outside the boundaries of the subflow zone. The inability of the Department of Justice to represent the interests of the United States in the status conference due to a lack of funding constitutes good cause for vacating the status conference. The status conference will be reset promptly after the United States Justice Department is funded.

## Objections to Report

Pursuant to A.R.S. §45-257, a claimant may file objections to a final report submitted by the Special Master within 60 days after the report is filed with the court. The statutory deadline is extended to 180 days if the report covers an entire subwatershed or federal reservation. As the Report addresses the appropriate test for assessing cones of depression for purposes of determining the court's jurisdiction over wells in the San Pedro River watershed, the 180-day deadline can apply to the filing objections to the Report.

IT IS ORDERED vacating the status conference set for January 11, 2019.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that written objections to the Report shall be filed on or before May 13, 2019. Responses to objections shall be filed on or before June 24, 2019.
