technical objections to the reports they were filed against. However, some of the
objections relating to the determination of individual wells either drawing subflow or
being of a de minimis use may be appropriately filed at a later date. The Court provides
the following guidance to claimants to assist with properly addressing their wells as part
of this adjudication:

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A. The technical reports are not final rulings. There are three **proposed** technical reports currently being evaluated by the Court:

- ADWR Technical Report on de minimis Claims in the Verde River Watershed (published August 2022) which proposes a methodology to expedite the evaluation of rights claimed for appropriable water for domestic uses, stockponds, and stock and wildlife watering within certain minimal amounts.
 - Subflow Zone Delineation Report for Verde River Mainstem & Sycamore Canyon (published December 2021) which delineates the proposed subflow zone for the for Verde River Mainstem & Sycamore Canyon
 - Subflow Zone Delineation Report for the Remainder of the Verde River Watershed (published April 2023) which delineates the proposed subflow zone for the for Remainder of the Verde River Watershed not part of the Mainstem or Sycamore Canyon

None of these reports have yet been recommended to the Adjudication Judge for approval. Prior to such a recommendation, each report will go through a short proceeding where parties will present evidence either for or against the technical recommendations of the report. Currently under review are potential **procedures** only. **No individual water rights will be adjudicated as part of these report proceedings**. Final recommendations on any of the reports are not expected until late in 2024.

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- **B.** You may get notice of the report even if your well is not within the subzone delineation based upon the geographical area ADWR is required to send notice.
- C. Subflow is a legal term and the subflow zone must be delineated according to specific legal and technical (geologic) criteria. The delineation takes no rights and is not a "rezoning." Wells that are within the final subflow zone will have an opportunity to demonstrate to the Court the depth at where the well is pumping water.
- **D.** All wells that could potentially be pumping surface water through the subflow are subject to the adjudication process. Having documentation does not exempt you from the process. Reviewing such documentation, along with other historical information and legal claims, is precisely the responsibility of the Adjudication Court when determining the extent and priority of the rights of all persons to use water in any river system and source.
- E. If you want to object to a specific well pumping from the subflow, or that a well should be included in a de minimis proceeding, the appropriate time to make those objections are when your specific well or Statement of Claimant ("SOC") is listed in the Hydrographic Survey Report ("HSR") for your area. The estimated publication dates for the preliminary HSRs for the Verde Watershed are as follows:

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- Sycamore Subwatershed March 6, 2026
- Lower Verde Valley subwatershed September 3, 2027
- Little Chino subwatershed March 9, 2029
 - Big Chino subwatershed March 9, 2029 _
- objections include specificity regarding **F.** Arizona law requires 26 the 27 recommendations in the report you are objecting to. Simply stating you 28 "object to the science" does not supply sufficient detail or specificity. Any

documentation provided must also address the specific issue under objection.

G. There are multiple technical reports for the Verde River Watershed. When reviewing deadlines for reports or court actions, please be sure you are looking at the correct report's proceedings schedule.

To ensure due process is met while also controlling the complexity of the filings, the Court is providing the following Case Management Orders:

II. **Updates to the Court Approved Mail List**

Under Arizona law, any person or entity who has filed a Statement of Claimant in an adjudication may file an objection to a report prepared by Arizona Department of Water Resources for that adjudication. Based on their earlier representations, the parties listed below were added to the Court-approved mailing list for this proceeding pending the appropriate filing of a Statement of Claimant. A review of the public records of Arizona Department of Water Resources conducted on January 23, 2024, did not show that a Statement of Claimant has been filed for any of the three named parties.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED the objections filed by these individuals will be dismissed and their names removed from the CAML.
