Department of Water Resources ("ADWR") to prepare a map and report of the

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subflow zone of the Verde River Mainstem and Sycamore Canyon Subwatershed ("Mainstem Report"). On December 30, 2021, the Special Master ordered ADWR to prepare a map and report of the remainder of the subflow zone of the Verde River subwatershed ("Remainder Report"). The period for filing objections to the Mainstem Report expired on May 2, 2022. The period for filing objections to the Remainder Report expired on October 27, 2023. On October 24, 2023, this Court granted a motion for summary judgement regarding objections to ADWR's delineation of the proposed subflow zone in the vicinity of Horseshoe Lake and Bartlett Lake as presented in the Mainstem Report. Similar objections regarding ADWR's delineation of the proposed subflow zone in the vicinity of Watson Lake, Granite Basin Lake, Sullivan Lake, and Willow Creek Reservoir have been filed, however no motion has yet been filed to the Remainder Report. Additionally, objections have been filed claiming ADWR did not adequately explain their methodology regarding characterization of the stream flow type and the length of certain tributary subflow delineations.

Once the Special Master has reviewed all objections, conducted any necessary oral arguments, and received any appropriate revisions to the subflow delineation from ADWR, a final subflow recommendation for the full Verde River will be provided to the General Stream Adjudication Judge for final approval. Prior to any recommendation, it is the responsibility of the Special Master to ensure a technical report is as complete, accurate, and as easily understandable as is possible given the complexities of Arizona geology, hydrogeology, geomorphology, and water law.

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IT IS ORDERED scheduling oral arguments for Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. The oral arguments will be held using the Court Connect program. Parties who have submitted valid objections to the Remainder Report will have 15 minutes to answer the following questions:

- 1) Is there any geologic, hydrogeologic, geomorphologic, or legal rationale to treat the instream lakes on the Upper Verde River (Watson Lake, Granite Basin Lake, Sullivan Lake, and Willow Creek Reservoir) differently from the instream lakes on the Lower Verde River (Horseshoe and Bartlett) with respect to pre-development subflow delineation?
- 2) Absent the ability to question authors, how should this court determine the reliability of published or unpublished reports or affidavits regarding geology, hydrogeology, and geomorphology?
- 3) What is the specific evidence that Big Chino Wash and Partridge Creek were perennial, intermittent, or ephemeral prior to human development of the area?

4) Should there be criteria for terminating the subflow delineation boundary before the end of the water flow in a tributary watercourse?

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any document used by ADWR for the subflow delineation for the Mainstern and Remainder Reports shall be available on the ADWR website by **December 10, 2023**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes section 45-256(B), the following objections are dismissed with prejudice for failure to address with specificity any recommendations from ADWR regarding the Verde Remainder Report and Subflow Delineation:

- Chino Grande, LLC provided no technical comments or objections.
- Sandy DuBois provided no evidence her well was within the subflow delineation boundary or any other specific objection to the subflow delineation boundaries.

As counsel for Chino Grande, LLC is already on the Court Approved Mailing List ("CAML") for this case due to other matters and will remain on the CAML. Sandy DuBois shall receive a courtesy copy of this Order but will not be added to the Court Approved Mailing List.
